Water Conservation Policy





1. 1. Water Conservation Policy

The primary goal of water conservation policy is to provide safe and clean potable water in the campus and also use optimum water were ever necessary. Student and staff are encourage to play a major role in the water sustainability strategies. The institution is committed to ensure that water is used most judiciously and is working towards making the area water sustainable. This has been achieved through the use of water efficient fixtures, rain water harvesting and smart water conservation practices. The institution collects water from Grampanchayat water supply department through the close water pipe and is stored in underground water storage tank. The institution is equipped with overbuilding water storage tanks for storage and uniform distribution of water in the campus. The college fixes leakages immediately and performs periodic maintenance required to prevent water losses.

Objectives

- 1. To collect rain water from rooftops of all institutional buildings, without disturbing the ecosystem.
- 2. To reduce water consumption using proper disposal of waste water
- 3. To use drip irrigation system to control water supply and use it for gardening.

***** Water Conservation Policy

Every drop of Rain is harvested from rooftops of buildings. And is conserved by recharging the bore well. Water storages tanks are made available in each building with float valves. Effective monitoring of water supply, and instant repairing of water leakage and control on overflow is continuously maintained. Reverse osmosis plants and water cooler plants are deployed in the institution to facilitate safe and clean drinking water as well as to reduce water wastage.

- ✓ Initiatives to engage the campus community in sustainability efforts through workshops, seminars, events and awareness campaigns

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

1.3 Policy on the Disabled Friendliness of Institution

The Government of India formulated the national policy for persons with disabilities in February 2006 which deals with educational rehabilitation of persons with disabilities, therefore in view of this, the college has implemented these policies in the teaching and learning process, admission process and participation in overall activities of the institution. The policy recognizes that persons with disabilities are valuable human resource for the institution and seeks to create an environment that provides equal opportunities, protection of their rights and full participation in the academic environment.

The focus of the policy is on the following:

- To ensure that the design of the building such as ramp/ lift should be according to the disabled persons.
- To ensure the accessible, gender-sensitive, safe, usable and functional washroom facilities should be provided for disabled persons.
- To ensure the proper text and pictogram signage such as tactile path, lights, display boards, signposts are necessary, located to be visible and touchable.
- ❖ The use of signage of male and female symbols, in accordance with local customs and standards, with raised outlines and bright colour contrast will be more evident to everyone and particularly helpful for persons with visual impairments.



- ❖ Learners with disabilities need to be adequately and appropriately supported in and out of the classroom with the right resources and assistive technology, and with leadership, teaching staff and college communities that are responsive to their needs.
- To ensure the accessibility of software tools and technology for the people with disabilities.
- Provision for enquiry and information: Human assistance, reader, scribe, soft copies of reading material, screen reading etc.



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
